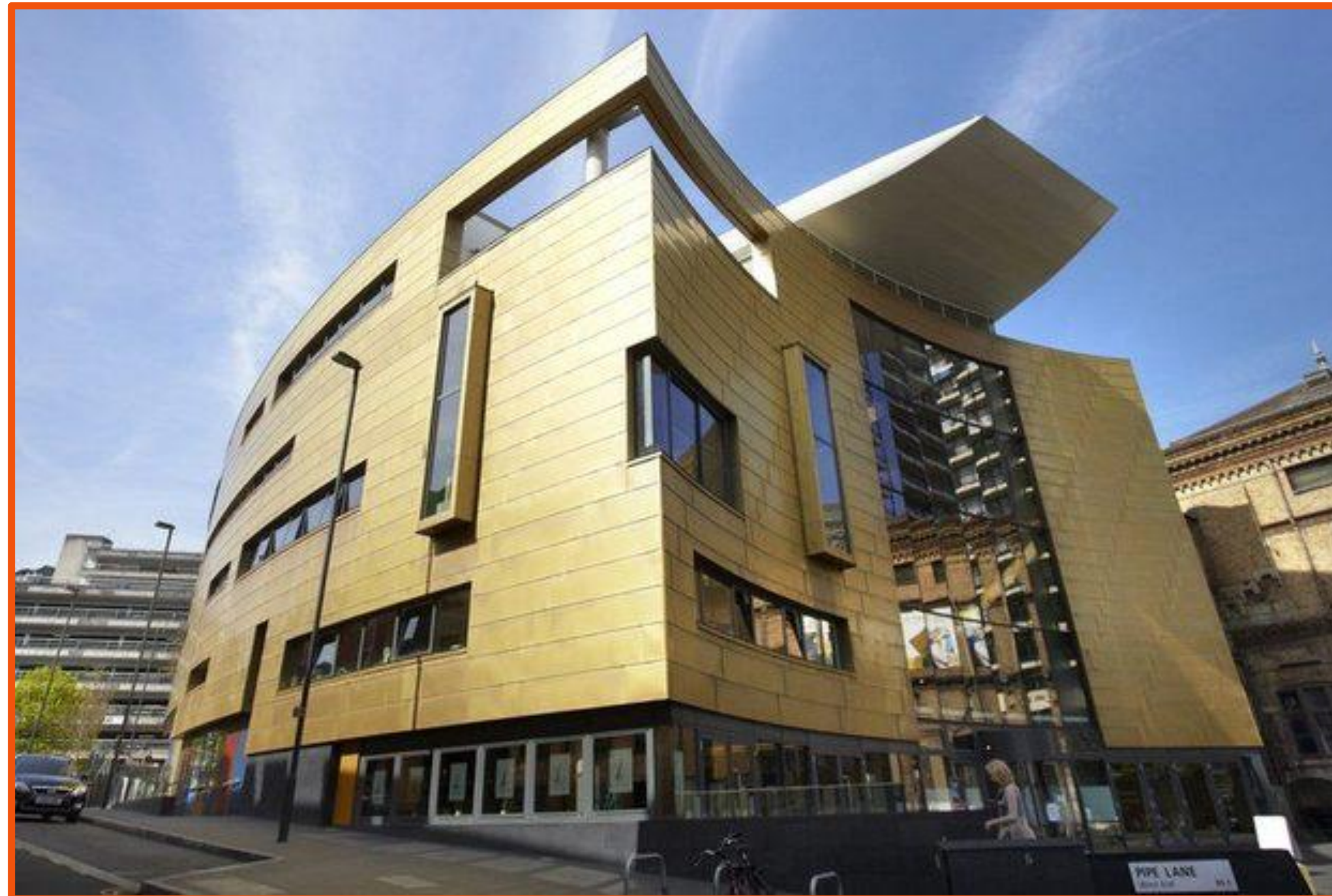


What is Hoo-Ha?

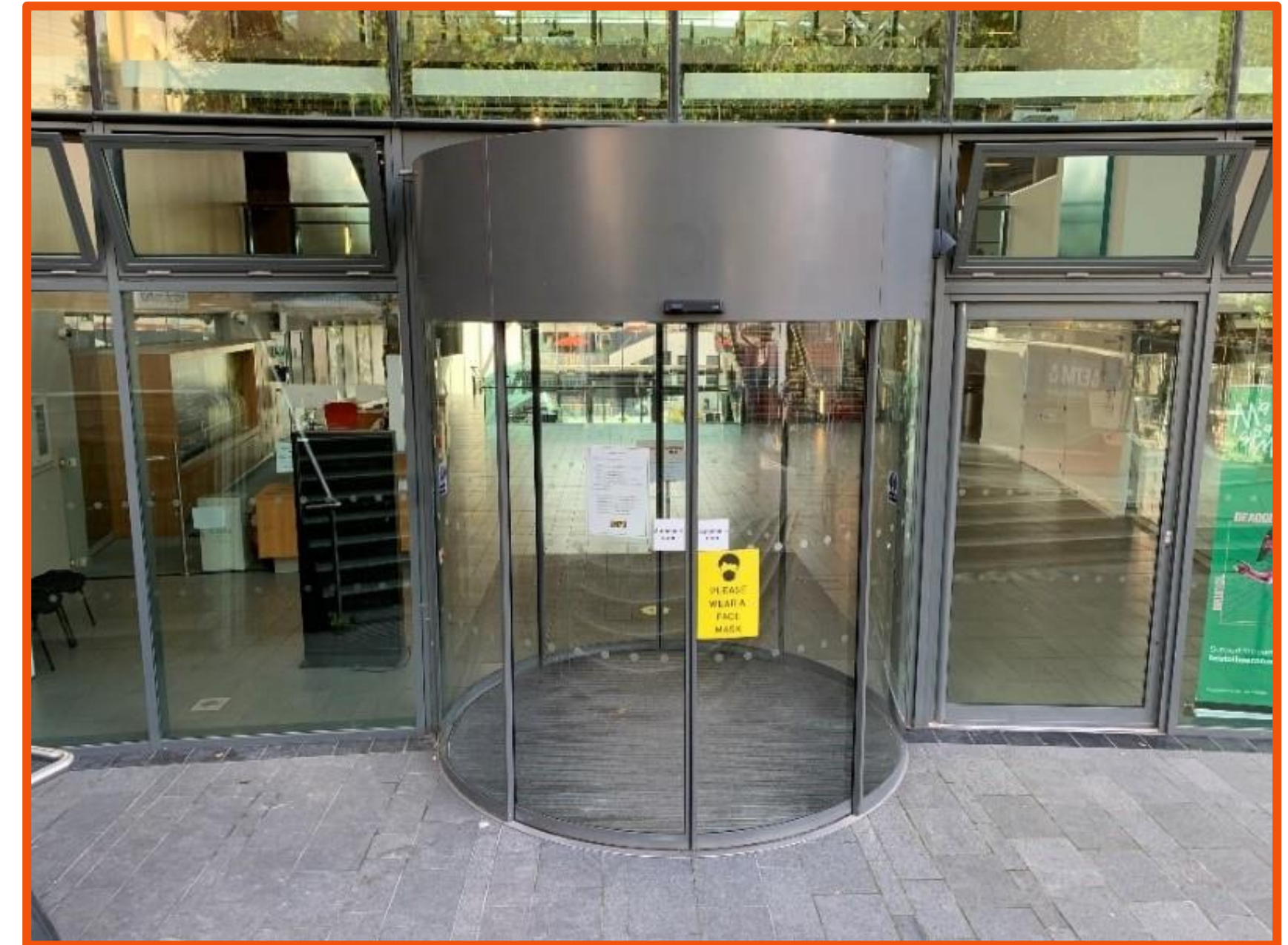
Hoo-Ha is a festival for families at Bristol Beacon.

Where is it taking place?

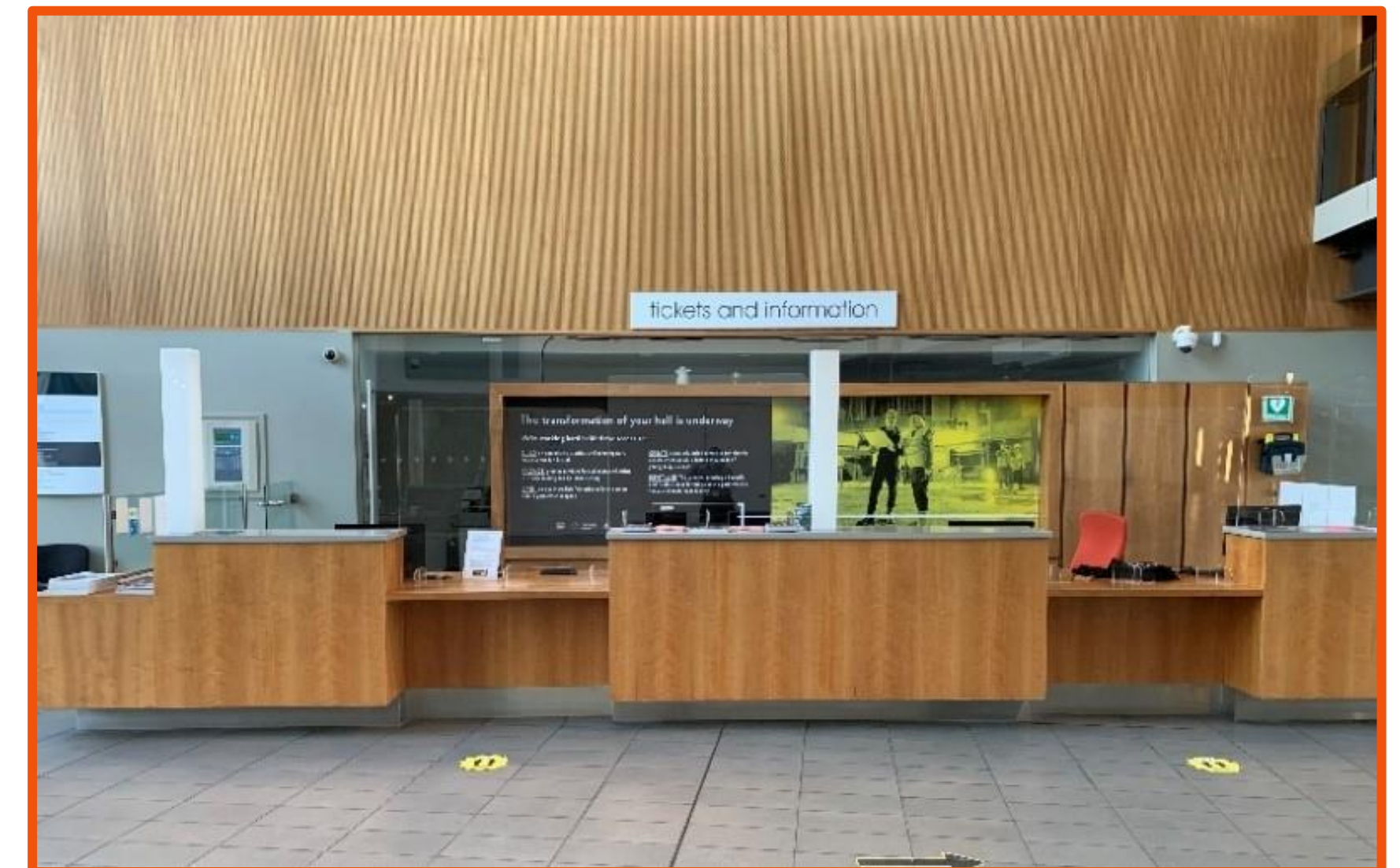
Hoo-Ha will take place on all floors across Bristol Beacon. Bristol Beacon looks like this



You can come in through the glass door on Trenchard Street



If you come in this door, you will be in our 'Box Office' area. The friendly Box Office staff will be able to answer any questions you might have.



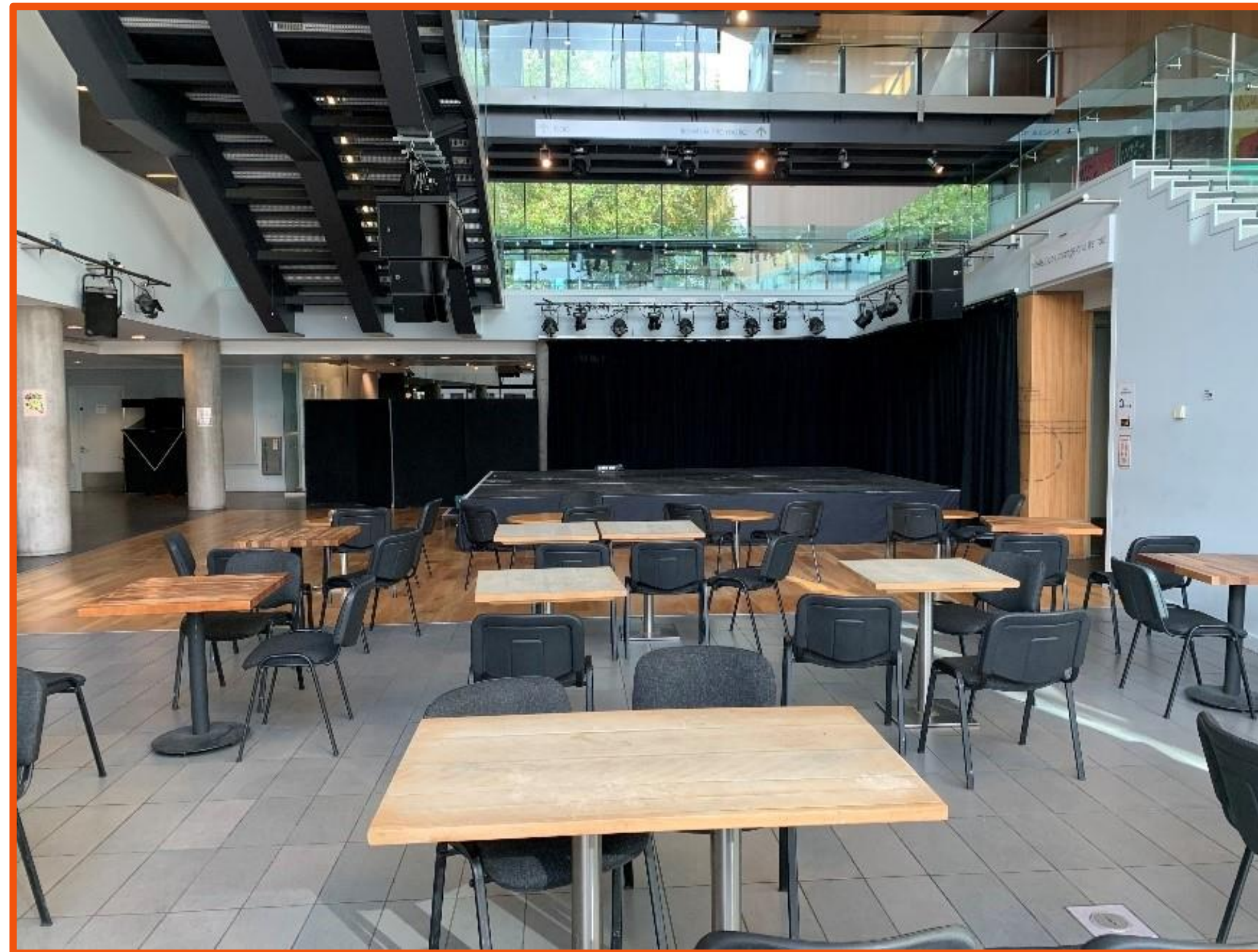
Or you can come in through the other glass door on Colston Street



If you come in this door, you will be in our 'foyer'.
The Bristol Loaf café is on your left.



In the foyer there will be a stage area. This is what it looks like with nobody there.



What can I do at Hoo-Ha?

On the main stage downstairs by the cafe you might see singing, dancing and musicians performing. Some of the musicians performing include Jim and Tara.

Tara sings and plays the keyboard. Jim plays the guitar.



A dance group called the Flamingo Chicks. They are not really Flamingo Chicks, they are dancers. Here is a picture.



And a really funny man who will play lots of party games and music to dance to. A bit like in this picture.



Outside the Box Office, there will be a huge dome that looks like this.

You can go into this dome and learn all about the stars.



On the **first floor** (which we call the 'stalls bar') you might see lots of craft activities, poetry and arts.

A group called **Let's Make Art**, will help you make some beautiful crowns.

And you can get your portrait drawn by Lucie from **Rubbish Portraits**. This is Lucie.



You will also be able to make your own models out of plasticine with **Aardman Studios**. Aardman Studios create the Wallace and Gromit and Shaun the Sheep films. You could make a model like the one in this picture.



On the third floor (which we call the terrace bar) you might take part in some music technology and book readings.

Enrico from Conductive Music, will be around to help you create you own beats and tracks on computers and ipads. This is Enrico.



Chill out zone

Our chill out zone will be located in **Meeting Room 2**. There will be lots of comfortable seating for you to take a bit of time to reset.

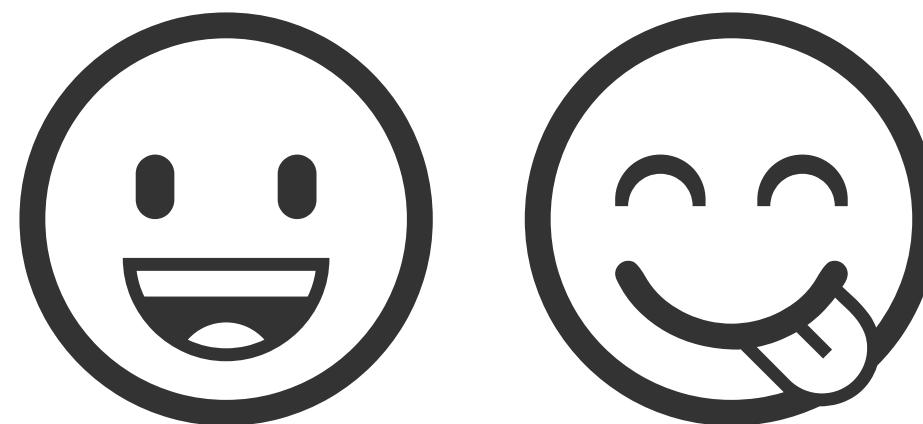
About Hoo-Ha! Festival

When/where?

The event will take place at Bristol Beacon, Trenchard Street, BS1 5AR, on **Wednesday 17 August**, from 10am-3pm.

The festival is also taking place on Thursday 18 and Friday 19 August, although will not have number restrictions in place. You do not need to book tickets for the 18 or 19 August festival dates.

How to book?

There are two sessions available on **Wednesday 17 August**:

10am-12.30pm and 12.30pm-3pm.

How can I get there?

Bristol Beacon is located at Trenchard Street, BS1 5AR.

Disabled parking can be found in the NCP Trenchard Street car park. A lay-by for curbside drop-off is immediately outside Bristol Beacon on Pipe Lane.

There is level access from Colston Street or Trenchard Street with automatic doors.

We have lifts to all floors.

Our accessible toilet facilities are found on all levels and are signposted in the building.

Registered assistance dogs and emotional support animals are allowed.
