## Ideas to make your evening with London Symphony Orchestra one to remember...

Play some classical music in the communal spaces in the days/weeks leading up to the screening to remind people and get them in the mood.

Invite family members of residents to come along and enjoy the screening with them – an occasion they can share in together.

Invite your audience to get dressed up. Making some effort can really make it feel like more of an evening out.

Serve refreshments, such as cheese and wine – always a great way to tempt more audience members!

If you have access to any, bring along some instruments for audience members to get a closer look at.

Or, why not make your own cardboard violins and hand them out for residents to play? Add some dowling for a bow and invite them to become a member of the orchestra!

Encourage movement to the music, and joining in with applause when the performances end.

Hand out paper and art materials if some people find looking at screens tiring and encourage doodling, painting or mark-making to the music. Then you'll have some colourful musical art to exhibit on your walls the following weeks!
